The dining hall was booked but due to the noise of an outside generator the meeting was moved into the big hall. The bad acoustics in the hall meant that some present suggested that a microphone would have made it easier to hear the candidates.</li> <li>• Sandra has attended a meeting re the Pipe Band Championships, the meeting was well attended and very positive with offers of help in several categories. If anyone is interested please contact Ian Widdowson at Beaver Travel or Carlo Miele.</li> <li>• The FiB litter pick went well although the Easter Egg Hunt on 8<sup>th</sup> April was poorly attended with only 1 or 2 children turning up.</li> <li>• Film Forres showed Hugo on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> April with 150 people turning up to the viewing. However, the Film Marathon Day was a disappointment with only 35 people turning up during the whole day. A discussion took place as to why there was a lack of younger people and the perception seems to be that younger members may not think it “cool” to attend. | Age Scotland – Forres Concerns    | Naomi Zair attended this meeting, there were 30+ people present including Susie Gentle who stated that a map would be needed of Forres. There is already a map although lots of changes suggested by Age Scotland are not on this map. It was suggested instead of new paving stones a zebra crossing would be more useful down at the war memorial. John Bremner stated that a few years ago McCarthy and Stone went to the Moray Council and gave a presentation at which they agreed to put in a crossing at Market Street and a CCTV camera was to be placed in the centre of the roundabout; when this went before the Moray Council Planning Department the idea was scrubbed as the Council said it was not needed. Naomi suggested that Susie Gentle came to the FAF and gave a talk as to what Age Scotland's aims are. Carin to contact Susie Gentle.   | CS       |
| FAF Grant Assistance Form         | The FAF grant assistance form had two amendments before it could be signed off these were after the title Forres Area Forum the initials FAF in brackets are to be added and at point 3 the following is to be added after the word receipts – “within an agreed time scale”. Anne Skene queried as to how this was to be publicised and Carin replied that there had been articles placed in the Gazette and another could be put in before June, work would be done with FACTs Lead Development Officers (LDO) and the CSU to disseminate the form further.
