1. Welcome	Brian McDonald welcomed everyone to the meeting and

3. Minute of FAF Meeting held in June 2014	There was one amendment: Under AOB Naomi Zair has stepped down from the position of Chair of the BALL Group with Wendy Strachan from The Moray Council (TMC) in place as interim Co-ordinator. Joyce MacDonald and Julie McKay who are Joint Chairpersons are currently away and Naomi is undertaking the role in conjunction with Wendy. The minutes were proposed by John Bremner and seconded by Naomi Zair.	
4. Matters Arising	<ul> <li>A cheque for £200 has been posted to Adrian Hutchins for the purchase of items in connection with the Mosset Burn Conservation Society.</li> <li>Councillor Creswell and John Bremner had been in touch about the positioning of the saluting dais on Armed Forces Day.</li> </ul>	
5. Treasurers Report	Current balance stands at £2,743.49 with 1 cheque cashed; £50 for secretarial duties. This leaves £2.90 left to spend on MTP money and there is £276 set aside for insurance. The account earned 29p	



	interest. The grant has yet to be paid. To aid in the release of grant money John Bremner is to email a copy of the accounts for the year 2013 – 2014 to Iain Todd (Iain received a 12 month paper copy of the accounts at the last FAF meeting). Request from John Ferguson, Community Planning and Development Manager, TMC for a copy of the annual accounts – Iain Todd to forward on to Andrea McArthur, TMC. Councillor Creswell queried whether a group in Rafford who wished to bulk buy oil could apply for money for fliers and communication costs from FAF, suggestion they may be able to apply for a grant of £200. As they are not a constituted group those present would agree to invite a grant application which would be discussed at the next meeting. John Bremner to forward a copy of the grant form to Councillor Creswell who will pass on to those concerned. Names of those on the sub group to discuss grants are Sandra Maclennan, John Bremner and Debbie Herron. Proposed by Fabio Villani and agreed by those present.	JB
6. Moray Towns Partnership (MTP)	There is an under spend of £2,000 on the maps which are in circulation, the majority stored within the FACT building. This occurred in part to the use of thinner paper and the lower costs incurred in production. 10,000 of both the flat and folded maps have been printed with a great many changes incorporated. The maps have been sent to many local businesses together with local hoteliers and accommodation providers. Findhorn Bay Arts Festival (FBAF) are developing a database of accommodation providers stretching from Elgin to Nairn, a college student is currently employed by FBAF. If FAF are able to cover the postage costs FBAF are willing to provide administrative personnel to post out maps along with their own newsletter. Members present commented on the lack of branding on maps throughout Forres i.e. no use of the same fonts or colours. The Chair stated there would be a Moray Speyside Forres branding on the maps which is part of an overall brand for the area. A discussion ensued, £30,000 was spent on Moray Speyside branding some years ago and part of Cameron Taylor's job remit includes developing this recognised brand using current guidelines. Chair to contact Cameron for a copy of the guidelines which are to be emailed to the Secretary for circulation. Town Centre Working Group (TCWG) - Debbie Herron facilitates this group and although enthusiastic they have no budget, she would like to bring proposals from them via FACT to FAF, those present were in favour. Fabio Villani queried planning for a real event at Bogton, Councillor Rodgers told those present Stuart Noble was unable to help at present possibility of money from the Co-op if yes re-raise the issue possibly in September – Bogton Group. The TCWG is looking at the possibility of new signage at the top of Tolbooth Street, needs to be a collective coordinated approach with Forres in Bloom (FiB) in attendance and in keeping with the other signs in Forres. The Fortes Footprints map is to be put on hold whilst the branding is looked in to.	BM TC
