- 10. Housing development The MC planners should stop the creeping urbanisation of rural Moray.
- 11. housing development they have plenty money to do affordable housing
- 12. Housing estate Look at empty garage plots. No garages on them and many unused. Sell some off.

Waste and recycling

- 4. Waste bins stop brown bin collection in rural areas
- 5. waste bins stop clogging streets and rural road ends with many bins. collect all and sift/sort centrally using modern separation techniques. co-ordination with other nearby councils
- 6. Waste collection bins could be emptied less often
- 7. Waste collection Change recycling to once a month.

- 9. Waste collection garden waste collection every 2 weeks during winter once a month
- 10. Waste collection paying for landfill
