<b>Partner Response:</b>
<p>On the issue of stopping building, the response is category 3: The working age population of Moray need accommodation to live and work. Development will not normally be allowed unless there is sufficient capacity in infrastructure.</p> <p>As regards the proposed leisure centre, the response is category 3: This is a venture by the private sector. The unemployment rate in Moray is consistently below the national average.</p> <p>As regards building more industrial sites and houses, the response is category 2 – the council is expanding its portfolio of industrial sites and aims to build 70 affordable houses a year. 4000 additional houses are in the planning pipeline for Elgin with additional sites identified across Moray. Development is managed via the Local Development Plan in which suitable sites are designated.
