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1.	Meeting Notes and Actions	
	Meeting note approved as an accurate record.	
	Gordon has previously circulated link to You Tube videos and JG added that Moray Council are currently working with Muckle Media updating My Moray website to include Talent Attraction so that there is only one website to promote Moray.	
	GL provided a flavour of what he has been doing since he started in June as Leader of the Council/Chair of ED&I and the direction in where he wants to go. GL wanted to meet with as many partners to put across a positive message in	

Moray and has already met with most from MEP. GL also met with local businesses included James Jones and visiting Macallan as well as Moray Chamber of Commerce and Moray Speyside Tourism.	
There are a lot of good things going on for Moray just now.	
Moray Growth Bid – Progress	
GL met with Robert Jenrick who indicated informally that Moray was likely to shortly get the green light to speak to treasury which was a very useful meeting and as of yesterday around 4pm Moray received an invitation to bid for Moray Growth Deal from the UK government which is a key milestone for us and a formal green light.	
Although every deal process differs slightly, it was anticipated that the next step would be for a funding allocation to be mentioned for Moray on 29 th October 2018 in the autumn budget statement.	
A revised programme timeline will be posted on My Moray website but we are aiming for negotiations for Heads of Terms to conclude between April and December 2019, which is flexible depending on other deals progressing. The final deal would then be around April 2020 – September 2021 which is a wide window but still an achievable timescale. The earliest to start would be 2021 with part of the cultural quarter.	
The Council and partners are meantime applying for external funding where possible to support the Growth Deal costs, for the Cultural Quarter project in particular, but this funding will be tied to its own timeline and we will only formalise it if we know the relevant projects will be in the final deal. The first two projects to progress to Outline Business case stage are Cultural Quarter and Moray Manufacturing Centre (previously known as Industry 4.0).	
A refresh of Strategic Outline Cases are to be completed by the end of September apart from UHI Hubs which will be the end of October and Community Access Points as staffing changes in NHS will have different timescales and these will be used in the negotiations.

3.	Moray Economic Strategy	
	In introducing the draft revised Moray Economic Strategy, JJ congratulated RG and her team and recognised the dependencies between MGD and MES but also the distinct roles each will play going forward for Moray. JJ has a background in strategy development and was extremely impressed with the MES drafting process led by DC, HIE.	
	DC reminded MEP that in May we agreed on 4 essential outcomes over the next 10 years and the layout of a high level strategy that will change over time but pulls out the most important things to focus on. MES needs also to build on opportunities and challenges as well as supporting all partners in the economy working together. This is still at draft stage but with a pragmatic view and the MES working group are due to meet next month.	
	We require all partners and stakeholders to work well for it to benefit the economy and need to look at what we need for entrepreneurs and start-up businesses and for public sector and large businesses to function well. All factors to be optimised.	
	DC gave a presentation stressing the need to add indicators to the strategy to show progress over the next 3 years and set challenges we want to focus on in relation to the 4 high level outcomes.	
	MES is a marker but we need to discuss what will be done and the working group have started looking at this.	
	DP who is part of the working group advised they all interlink and fit in but there are students leaving UHI with qualifications but that attainment doesn't count if they leave the region but will be looking at STEM based qualifications to meet the needs here. We also need to tell the story of Moray and what we have to offer.	
	DM added that the focus is on higher education and it is challenging but need to communicate with local businesses and parents for local opportunities and not only emphasise the academic route but also the more work based options like apprenticeships.	
	SM mentioned that work requires to be done with employers, recruitment strategies and recruitment policies and communications with Moray Chamber

	Moray Council was the Employability Moray lead. In terms of the revised governance arrangements shown in the diagram, MEP should be the overarching strategic partnership and there would then be an Employability and Skills Group set up which would replace the Skills and Training Group and would be chaired by JG at the outset anyway.
	Everyone who has seen the proposal in the diagram so far is happy with it and this included the Community Planning Officers Group and the Community Planning Board but RG invited any further comments from MEP.
	DM mentioned to be aware that MEP would then come under Education Scotland if CLD was linked in through the Employability and Skills Group.
	JJ suggested waiting one more meeting until the strategy delivery and to look at the MEP delivery groups together.
5.	LOIP Action Plan
	Action plan is currently sitting with partners at Community Partnership Board level – JG, DM and Maxine Scott have looked at actions for the economic development priority and pulled together indicators and targets that are most relevant. Most of the actions are direct from the Skills Investment Plan.
	JG will circulate once it has been returned in a more readable format but has the same sort of targets as MES.
6.	Tourism – report by Moray Speyside Tourism (MST)
	Laurie circulated a summary of stats (also attached) and added that every single year Tourism is getting better and they are doing more. Tourism has not been done correctly in the past and has been challenging in the last 4-5 years but need to start looking at the next 5 years.
	MST have identified a funding model that is the Tourism Business Improvement District (T-BID) for the future of MST and from the 8 th October every business will see electronic surveys to complete what they want and they will engage with everyone one by one to make sure they have spoken to everyone. They will launch ballot for yes funding and if not voted forward that will be the end from his perspective as other funding sources are neither adequate nor sustainable.
	JJ emphasised that we are facing a 'cliff edge' with regard to Tourism funding. Unless the Region secure the T-BID, or find another credible and enduring source of funding (and quickly), then the coordination and consolidation of tourism will be once again be on hold. He thanked LP for his both his

	Tourism tax which could be 2-3 years away is also a challenge and how it looks for tourism businesses so they will need to be convinced but requires support and effort to make both a T Bid and tourism tax work.	
	FG added that he doesn't think it's right for every area and is all about balance and where there are significant infrastructure needs.
