### **COLD CALLING SEASON IS COMING**

With the better weather arriving it is the time of year for Cold Calling to increase. Offers of roofing work, garden services and the like. Common practices include high pressure / aggressive sales techniques and carrying out unnecessary work to a low standard at inflated cost. The most serious problems being associated with higher value home and garden repairs and maintenance.

Trading Standards advice is **never to agree to work on the doorstep**. If you think that work is needed to your property get quotes from two or three traders and compare them. Ask someone you can trust for a recommendation, or use a recognised trader approval scheme. Don't hurry to part with your money.

### **Digitally Enabled Policing**

#### **Introduction of Mobile Working**

From July 22 Mobile Working will be introduced to the North East and Moray in particular.

Mobile Working means that Police Officers will be operating mobile devices as part of their operational duties.

You may notice something different about your local police officers' uniform. They will now be in possession of mobile devices which may be secured to their body armour / jackets adjacent to their radio.

This means that Officers will be able to use their mobile devices to remotely access Police systems which will increase Officers' time working with the public and on incidents - or conducting patrols and preventing crime.

#### **Key points**

- From summer 2019, members of the public will see Police Scotland Officers using mobile devices as part of their operational duties. This means you may see Police Officers operating mobile devices in public areas or within police vehicles.
- The addition of mobile devices will mean Police Officers can do more administrative tasks whilst out with a Police building meaning less time is spent within Police stations.
- Officers are permitted to work from their mobile devices in public places – this is also a chance for both members of the public and Police Officers to engage.
- Mobile Working will help to increase officer visibility, engagement and accessibility to the public.
- Mobile Working is positively changing the operational Policing approach in Scotland through the improved use of mobile technology and a change in culture which allows officers to work more effectively within communities.

## **BUCKIE, KEITH & STRATHISLA AREA POLICING TEAM**

### **SERIOUS AND ORGANISED CRIME**

#### **Buckie**

During the early hours of 22/06, report was received of a disturbance at a house on South Land Street, Buckie. An 18 year old man was arrested and kept for court on charges of serious assault, assault, and threats.

On 23/06, a 29 year old man was arrested and kept for court following a serious assault, threats, and a vandalism at St. Andrews Court, Buckie.

#### **Keith**

On 17/06, a 17 year old male was found in possession of a personal amount of cannabis on Union Street, Keith, and was issued with a fixed penalty. The same male was driving a car without insurance and his car was seized.

### **ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, VIOLENCE AND DISORDER**

#### **Buckie**

On 02/06/19, a 28 year old man was issued with an anti-social fixed penalty for urinating in front of Kiss Nightclub, Buckie.

On 03/06/19, a 32 year old man reported being assaulted (punched) on West Church Street, Buckie. A positive line of enquiry is being followed up.

On 03/06/19, report was received of a drunk male shouting at children on Lawson Place, Buckie. The suspect was traced nearby and issued with an anti-social behaviour fixed penalty.

During the early hours of 05/06, a 15 year old boy was assaulted near the Well Road Bakery. CCTV and other lines of enquiry are being progressed.

During the morning of 07/06, a pane of glass in a shed on Mill Crescent was smashed by unknown means.

On 08/06, an 18 year old man was assaulted in Cluny Square, Buckie. A 17 year old man was traced and reported for assault.

On 08/06, a 44 year old woman reported being assaulted outside Sandison's Bar, Buckie. An 18 year old woman was subsequently charged with assault and reported to the PF.

On 08/06, a 17 year old man reported being threatened by an 18 year old on Great Western Road, Buckie. The perpetrator has been charged and reported.

On 14/06, a drunk 18 year old male refused to leave Kiss Nightclub when required to do so by door staff. He has been charged and is to be reported to the PF.

Overnight on 14/06 – 15/06, a window was smashed at a house on Wallace Avenue, Buckie. A male known to the householder was later interviewed but denied all knowledge.

On 16/06, report was received of a woman shouting and swearing in the street on Brodie Avenue, Buckie. A 23 year old woman has been identified as being responsible and efforts are ongoing to trace her.

About 1230 hours on 17/06, a hoax call was made to Coastguard and Buckie RNLI regarding a boat in requiring assistance near Lossiemouth. Burghead Coastguard and Buckie lifeboat were deployed for a period of about 3 hours. The suspect had sent the initial message via Facebook but deleted the Facebook account shortly thereafter. The cost of the call is estimated at approximately £30k. Enquiries are ongoing.

On 19/06, a window at a house on Samson Avenue, Buckie, was broken by unknown means. Enquiry is ongoing. Also overnight on 19/06, the body work of a car was scratched on Mair Street, Buckie.

On 19/06, a 65 year old man reported being assaulted on Garden Lane, Buckie. A positive line of enquiry is being followed up.

Between 18/06 – 24/06, several reports were received from householders in and around the Hall Street area of Buckie regarding a male acting suspiciously in their gardens and around their houses. Officers traced a 31 year old man fitting the description nearby and he was arrested, charged, and kept for court.

Five domestic incidents and one breach of bail offence were also reported.

### **Findochty**

Overnight on 03/06 – 04/06, two cars had their bodywork scratched by unknown means whilst parked unattended on New Street, Findochty. Enquiries are ongoing.

### **Cullen**

Overnight on 07/06 – 08/06, an external pane of glass at Cullen Primary was broken by unknown means.

During the afternoon of 17/06, a red Honda Jazz car was damaged (dented with a stone) on Seafield Road, Cullen. Enquiry is ongoing.

### **Keith**

On 08/06, a 46 year old man was issued with an anti-social behaviour ticket for disorderly behaviour on Mid Street, Keith.

Between 01/06 – 08/06, report was received of someone throwing a stone at geese in the Auchindoun area of Keith. A 40 year old woman has been charged with wildlife offences and reported to the court.

On 12/06, a male in the Keith area reported a 'sextortion' whereby he shared a personal image during a private chat using an online app and the recipient then threatened to share the image unless money was paid. On 16/06, a 21 year old man was issued with an antisocial behaviour fixed penalty following him shouting and swearing in the street at Den Crescent.

On 17/06, an 18 year old male was charged with making threatening and abusive phone calls to another male in the Keith area.

On 20/06, a 34 year old male was arrested for threatening behaviour and police assault outside Tesco, Keith. He has been reported to the court.

On 21/06, damage to a shed panel was discovered at Keith Golf Club and an offensive word had been written on the shed in chalk. Given the damage caused (and the spelling), it appears

## **ACQUISITIVE CRIME**

### **Buckie**

On 07/06, a bottle of whisky was stolen from the Co-op, East Church Street, Buckie. A woman has been identified from CCTV and efforts are ongoing to trace and deal with her.

On 08/06, a 42 year old woman was caught stealing candles and other items from Tesco in Buckie. A report has been submitted.

On 09/06, a 28 year old man was caught stealing chicken bites from the Co-op in Buckie. Given the man was under the influence and the amount stolen was negligible, he has been given a Police warning.

On 11/06, a theft of £10 of fuel was reported at Moravian Motors, Buckie. The male driver has still to be traced.

Between 17/06 – 21/06, a gas cylinder was stolen from an insecure garden shed at a property in Arradoul.

### **Keith**

Late evening on 03/06, two males were seen entering skips within the council yard at Balloch Road, Keith. It is unknown if they stole anything but efforts are ongoing to trace them.

On 06/06, a male shoplifter left Tesco in Keith with a trolley of goods valued at approximately £400. CCTV and vehicle related enquiries are ongoing.

Between 19/06 – 21/06 a caravan near Islabank Mills was entered and rummaged through. It appears someone may have been looking for somewhere to sleep and nothing appeared to have been stolen. Passing attention will be given to the area and enquiry is ongoing.

During the late evening of 23/06, a male with plastic containers was disturbed by staff within the Moray Council Yard at Station Road, Keith. Police were not called at this time and the male fled. CCTV review unfortunately does not cover the area in question but enquiries are ongoing.

## **ROAD SAFETY**

### **Buckie**

Following reports of inconsiderate parking around Portessie Primary, officers attended at the school during school pick up and drop off times and educated parents about parking issues around the school. The school were also spoken to and advised a walk to school initiative has been set up. Further work is to be done around other schools in the Buckie area after the school holidays.

On 03/06, a female motorist was stopped by Police on Land Street, Buckie, and found to have no insurance. Her car was seized by Police and a report has been sent to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 07/06, a female driver reported feeling threatened by a male motorist on Cairnfield Crescent, Buckie, in what appears to be a road rage type incident. A male has been identified and enquiries are ongoing.

On 08/06, a 55 year old man was stopped driving on the A990 Buckie – Portgordon road and found to have no insurance. His car was seized and he has been reported to the court.

On 17/06, a 47 year old man was stopped for having a dangerously loaded trailer on March Road, Buckie. He has been reported to the court.

### **Keith**

On 01/06, a hit and run occurred within the car park at Tesco, Keith, and a red Ford Fiesta was damaged (scrape marks along the rear). Enquiry is ongoing.

On 07/06, a 76 year old man was stopped on the A95 near Keith due to his car being in a dangerous condition (loose battery). He has been reported.

A 65 year old man has been reported to the PF for light and brake defects found regarding his agricultural trailer when it was stopped on the A95 near Keith on 19/06. A 46 year old man was also reported for carrying a dangerous load on a trailer in the same area of Keith.

On 22/06, Police were alerted to a car that had no insurance on Cuthil Road, Keith. Enquiry is ongoing to trace and deal with the owner.

About 10.30 pm on 22/06, whilst anti-social driving patrols were being carried out in Keith town centre, a 23 year old male was charged with careless driving (accelerating harshly) on Moss Street. He was issued with an ASBO driver warning regarding his behaviour.

## **FORRES, SPEYSIDE AND GLENLIVET AREA POLICING TEAM**

### **SERIOUS AND ORGANISED CRIME**

#### **Forres**

On 11 June 2019, a property within Forres, a 22 year old female was charged and reported to the Procurator Fiscal for being in possession of a quantity of herbal cannabis.

On 17 June 2019, Police were on mobile patrol in Forres when they came across a group of youths in the woods. When speaking to the group it was apparent that there was a strong smell of cannabis coming from them. This then lead to searches of the group. Two males aged 14 and 16 have been charged and reported to the Youth Justice Management unit.

### **ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, VIOLENCE AND DISORDER**

#### **Forres**

On 02 June 2019, on Cumming Street, Forres a male was seriously assaulted resulting in injury. A 32 year old male has been charged and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 06 June 2019, a 15 year old male in Forres was reported to the Youth Justice Management Unit in relation to behaving in a threatening and abusive manner in a public place.

On 07 July 2019 police attended a report of a serious assault in licenced premises in Forres. One male sustained cuts to his head. A 22 year old male was arrested and appeared in court the following day. The licenced premises are now on increased checks both during the week and weekend.

#### **Speyside**

On 28 July 2019 a 46 year old male was caught by Police urinating in a shop doorway in Dufftown. He was issued with a fixed penalty notice.

### **ACQUISITIVE CRIME**

#### **Forres**

On 04 June 2019, a 44 year old female was charged in connection with an attempted theft in a Forres supermarket. This has resulted in a report being submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 11 June 2019 a house in Forres was broken in to. A quantity of money was taken. A 15 year old male has been charged with the offence and a report has been submitted to the Children's Reporter.

#### **Speyside**

On 04 and 05 July 2019 a local shop within Dufftown reported Theft by Shoplifting. Bottles of gin and vodka were taken. Security advice was given and enquiries are ongoing to identify those responsible.

On 21 July 2019 a 36 year old male was arrested and charged for Theft from a motor car and Theft from a house in Dufftown. He appeared in court and has been remanded in custody. He is a well-known offender and we are working with the housing to see if he can be placed in more suitable accommodation when he is released.



## **ROAD SAFETY**

### **Speyside**

On 18 June 2019, Police charged a 45 year old male with having on a public road, in Dufftown, two vehicles which did not have insurance or valid MOT certificates. One of these vehicles did not have visible registration plates displayed which resulted in report being submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 20 June 2019, Police witnessed an off road motorcycle being driving near to Aberlour and was stopped due to there being no displayed registration plates. This motorcycle was being driven by a 19 year old male who held only a provisional driving licence and displayed no "L" plates. This motorcycle was uninsured and did not hold a valid MOT certificate. The motorcycle was seized and a report was submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 26 June 2019, a tractor was stopped near to Knockando by Police after it was being seen driven with an un-roadworthy trailer, which had been carrying hay bales insecurely. A 64 year old male has been charged and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 02 July 2019 a 20 year old female was involved in a road accident in Craigellachie after failing to heed advice regarding a newly resurfaced road. It transpired that she did not have an insurance policy in place at that time. The owner of the vehicle was also reported for permitting the vehicle to be driven without insurance. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

### **Forres**

On 02 June 2019, a 21 year old male was reported to the Procurator Fiscal for traveling at a recorded speed of 94 mph in a 60 mph stretch of the A96 near Forres.

On 17 July 2019 a male was stopped driving his motor car after being observed by the Police being driven on the A96 near to Forres at excessive speed. The driver was found to have no current licence. He was arrested and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

### **General Information**

A number of speed checks by officers have been carried out this month in Kinloss, Grantown Road, Forres and Mannachie Road, Forres. These have taken place in the morning and evenings. There were two persons educated for travelling at 34 mph in Kinloss and the Grantown Road. All other drivers were sticking the speed limit. We will continue to actively carry out these checks and will choose other roads in the Forres and Speyside area that have been reported to us as experiencing speeding issues.

In relation to road safety please remember that temperatures in a vehicle can soar considerably in the heat that we have recently experienced. Children and pets should not be left alone in vehicles. Leaving windows slightly open is not sufficient to allow air to ventilate or for the vehicle to cool. The message is clear do not leave them in the car or you risk dire consequences.

In recent weather we have seen a number of sudden showers following periods of hot sunny weather. As a result it turns the road surface "greasy" and makes traction harder as a result you should slow your speed and give additional space for braking.

It is also the time of year that road resurfacing takes place and those familiar "chuckies" cover the roadways. Please remember to slow your speed as the warning signs indicate you

to do as once again if you brake hard on a road newly surfaced in this way, at speed, you are risking skidding in your vehicle and may end up striking another vehicle or leaving the carriageway entirely.

## **ELGIN LOSSIEMOUTH, FOCHABERS AREA POLICING TEAMS**

### **SERIOUS AND ORGANISED CRIME**

#### **Elgin**

On 2 July 2019, two males aged 38 and 24 were found in possession of Cannabis and Cocaine on the A941 Elgin to Lossiemouth Road, near Elgin. A report has been submitted to the procurator Fiscal.

On 5 July 2019 a 12 year old male set a fire on Meadow Crescent, Elgin and was also found to be in possession of a knife. He was subsequently charged and a report sent to the children's reporter.

#### **Innes**

On 7 July 2019, a 19 year old male was found in possession of a quantity of cannabis in Lhanbryde. A report has been sent to the procurator fiscal.

### **ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, VIOLENCE AND DISORDER**

#### **Elgin**

Between 0200 hours and 1000 hours on Saturday 22 June 2019, a car had tyres slashed in Langstane Place. Elgin. Enquiries on-going.

At 0030 hours on Sunday 9 June 2019, a 20 year old male was arrested at Joanna's Nightclub, City Arms Close, following a disturbance. He was later charged with Assault and possession of a controlled drug.

#### **Lossiemouth**

At 2215 hours on Saturday 20 July 2019, a van was vandalised on St Geradines Road, Lossiemouth. A 24 year old male was arrested and charged in relation to this and released on undertaking to appear at Elgin Sheriff Court.

### **ACQUISITIVE CRIME**

#### **Elgin**

Between 1930 hours on Wednesday 26 June and 1030 hours on Thursday 23 June 2019, a pedal cycle was stolen from Pinefield Apartments, Elgin. Enquiries on-going

Between 2100 hours on Tuesday 25 June and 2100 hours on Wednesday 26 June 2019, pipes on the roof of Deanshaugh Primary School, Deanshaugh Road, Elgin were damaged. Enquiry ongoing with suspects identified.

About 1400 hours, on Friday 21 June 2019, a 26 year old female was seen to steal items from Superdrug and attempt to Steal Items from WH Smiths, on High Street, Elgin. She was later arrested and charged. A report will be submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 13 July 2019 a 25 year old male was seen trying car doors within the grounds of Dr Gray's hospital. He was traced and charged and a report submitted to the procurator Fiscal. During the early hours of 24 July 2019 two males aged 14 and 15 were caught stealing alcohol from Asda, Edgar Road. They have both been charged and are being dealt with via the youth justice system.

On 4 July 2019, a till was stolen from a shop on Batchen Lane, Elgin, enquiry is ongoing into this.

On 9 July it was found that there had been an attempt to break into H Samuels on High Street, Elgin. Enquiry is ongoing into this.

On 17 July it was discovered that tools had been stolen from the Oldmill at Oldmills, Elgin. Enquiry is ongoing into this.

### **Lossiemouth**

About 1610 hours on Saturday 1 June 2019, 14 year old male stole two bottles of wine from the Co-operative, Queen St, Lossiemouth. The male has been charged and reported to the Youth Justice Team.

At 0440 hours on Friday 28 June 2019, 44 and 25 year old males were seen opening and attempting to open car doors in Queen St, Lossiemouth. They were traced by Police, arrested and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal relating to Theft and Attempted Theft.

During the early hours of Monday 1 July 2019, a house was broken into in Community way, Lossiemouth. A 48 Year old female was subsequently arrested and charged in relation to this and appeared from custody at Elgin Sheriff Court.

### **Burghead**

Between 1930 hours on Tuesday 4 June and 0830 hours on Wednesday 5 June 2019, a vehicle was broken into in Granary Street, Burghead and various tools stolen. Enquiries ongoing.

### **Lennox**

On 21 July 2019, a quantity of timber was stolen from a building site at Ordequish Road, Fochabers. Enquiry is ongoing into this.

## **ROAD SAFETY**

### **Elgin**

At 0955 hours on Sunday 23 June 2019, a 25 year old female was found to be driving on Eat Road, Elgin whilst over the prescribed drink drive limit. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

About 1350 hours, on Thursday 13 June 2019, a 26 year old male failed to stop his motor vehicle when requested to do so by Police. When subsequently stopped the male was found to be disqualified from driving and driving without insurance. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

### **Lossiemouth**

During July 2019, three people were arrested for drink driving in Lossiemouth. Two were released on Undertaking, however the third due to being almost seven times over the legal limit was kept in custody to appear at Court.

### **Innes**

At 1750 hours on Tuesday 4 June a 27 year old male was detected travelling at 96 Miles per hours, in a 60- mile per hour limit, on the B9103 near Lhanbryde. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

**Lennox**

On Thursday 25 July a 27 year old male was detected travelling at 101 Miles per hours, in a 60 miles per hour limit, on the A96 Fochabers by-pass. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

## **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service**

Back in October 2017 the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service launched the Community Asset Register (CAR).

Essentially this is a register of volunteers who have a particular asset or skill which they feel could be used to support emergency services and responders at an incident.

Examples include someone with a boat who could be called in times of flooding to assist evacuate people from houses to a place of safety. Similarly someone with a 4X4 may be used in times of severe snow to transport vulnerable people to a community hall.
