## MINUTES OF FORRES AREA FORUM MEETING WEDNESDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2026



3.	<p><b>Minute of meeting held on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2026:</b></p> <p>The minutes from this meeting had been circulated, there were no amendments. The minutes were proposed by Loretta and seconded by Tina.</p>	
4.	<p><b>Matters arising:</b></p> <p>Our grant application to the Auchernack Trust was successful receiving the full amount requested - £750.00. This money will be ringfenced to meet the objectives of the grant application. Chair will submit a report to the Trust on completion of the spend in accordance with grant award criteria. Treasurer will support this by creating a balance sheet to accompany this report. Statistics will be required for events held and feedback from those attending.</p> <p>AR has completed the necessary admin work to receive the grant funding which will be transferred shortly.</p> <p>A programme of events will be created for this particular age group over the course of the year. It is hoped to work in partnership with key services and groups to support the over 60's to meet their needs. Chair has already made contact with some services and groups including Moray Food Plus, Benefits and heat and energy savings and NHS Grampian, Active Moray with a suggested topic of foods, cooking and budgeting. Now that we have funding in place further progress and plans can be developed.</p>	LO AR

15.	<p><b>System Based Approach to Physical Activity and Health (to be re-named Active Moray Strategy and Plan):</b></p> <p>Change of launch date, now to be in March but still to be confirmed. Work is going on behind the scenes with partners of this plan working on their areas. To date reports have been met with support from those who have been present at the Community Planning Officers Group (CPOG). 16.	<p><b>Forres ASG Fire Report:</b></p> <p>Grateful thanks to Mark Witkowski, Station Commander Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire &amp; Moray LSO Area. Scottish Fire and Rescue Service for submitting this report and going forward will be submitted quarterly.</p>  <p>The dashboard provides a high-level overview of fire incidents and service operations. Key data points include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Incidents:</b> Total 149, Accidental Fires 57, Total Fires 62, Deliberate Fires 5.</li> <li><b>Fire Types:</b> Outdoor Fires 40, Building Fires 20, Vehicle Fires 2, Large Outdoor / Wildfires 7, Dwelling 15, Other Residential 1, Non Residential 2, Road Vehicle 2, Refusa 9, ADF 15, Chimney Fires 1, Enforceable Premise / Non Domestic 2, Other Vehicle 0.</li> <li><b>Special Services:</b> Inter-Agency 15, Humanitarian 1, Assist Other Agencies 4, Effecting Entry / Exit 2, Medical Responder 0, Lift Release 0, Rescue/Release of Persons 1, Removal of object from person/ Removal of people from object 0.</li> <li><b>False Alarms:</b> False Alarms Total 53, False Alarm Apparatus 29, False Alarm Good Intent 24, False Alarm Malicious 0, UFAS 11.</li> </ul> <p>Other details include 0 fatalities, 0 fire fatalities, 0 hospitalised casualties, 2 first aid casualties, 0 precautionary check casualties, and 0 rescued individuals.</p>	

17.	<p><b>Ray's Opportunities:</b></p> <p>On behalf of Ray's Opportunities, I am pleased to be able to tell you a few things more about our Ray's Rest Rooms plans which you can share with your networks. It's exciting.</p> <p>We are delighted that the Scottish Government has granted us the funds to establish a CPT in Forres, on the site of the currently derelict Ley's Road toilet block.</p> <p>The Scottish Government CPT fund is designed for disabled people families and carers, to increase –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• opportunities to take part in leisure and other activities outside</li> <li>• the house and to enjoy outdoor spaces</li> <li>• connections to other people and with the community</li> <li>• wellbeing and fun</li> <li>• safety, dignity and confidence when going out</li> </ul> <p>It addresses the issue of people, adults and children, with complex needs who need more support in the community if they are to be able to get out and about with their carers, and experience relative independence, without the indignity of having to be changed on the floor. A Changing Places toilet has a hoist and a bed and other features which accommodate those needs.</p> <p>As you know, this for us is nested in a wider project which is to establish a new modern Rest Room facility, badly needed, in the centre of our town, designated a Heritage Quarter. This is for everyone in our community and for travellers, tourists, hopefully adding to the attraction of Forres as a destination and thus supporting the local economy. On this basis, a planning application is currently lodged with Moray Council. Part of the building will be sectioned off as a street food outlet, facing east towards Leys Road, sitting behind the Coop. The purpose of this is to sustain the maintenance of the unit, particularly the CPT which obviously needs to be kept safe and secure for all its users. It will be let on this basis, as a small entrepreneurial opportunity, not in any way to compete with other high street offerings, but as, we hope, a fun addition.</p> <p>Fundraising; we can't do any of this without more help. Our recent small survey gave us great confidence that local people support the project 100%. But we will of course have to ask people to back up their support with some of their hard-earned cash to help us move forward. We are applying for whatever public funds are available to us - we will be grateful for any help we can get – and we will shortly be launching a Crowdfunding initiative; this will be aimed at funding the new roof on the building, necessary to accommodate the required height of the CPT, and giving a much more attractive pitched appearance to the whole thing. And it will give us breathing space to develop the interior to the quality we aspire to. The Crowdfunder will be called <i>Ray's the Roof</i> and you will have details as soon as they are fixed and the scheme is launched – Ray McDonald</p>
