2. Matters arising	Moray Community Planning Partnership MW had contacted Cllr Alexander in response to Cllr Diver's concerns about the MCPP's apparent lack of awareness of the MCJP. Cllr Alexander had received advice from Mike Palmer of the Scottish Government that "Community Justice Partners are statutorily accountable to each other within their locally agreed partnership agreements and not to the Community Planning Partnership.
