2. Previous Minute & Matters Arising	Minutes of the meeting held on 30 th June 2022 were approved. Matters Arising DB has adopted the role of vice-chair. It is anticipated that the Ooutcomes and Performance Improvement Framework (OPIF) will be published later this year.	

3.	Diversion from Prosecution Inspection	The Diversion from Prosecution inspection will commence on 22 nd August. The inspection will review the processes within the Police, Procurator Fiscal Service and Moray Council Justice Services. It is anticipated the focus will be on the relationships with partner agencies. 3 focus groups have been arranged; senior strategic, frontline social worker, and team manager and senior social worker. The senior strategic group will take place in the afternoon of 23 rd August and both the frontline social worker and team manager and senior social worker groups will take place on 25 th August. Pre-focus groups will be arranged in due course. All groups will take place within the Moray Council annexe meeting rooms. If anyone wishes to join a focus group, please contact TR. File inspections will take place on 23 rd August and individuals open to justice services will be interviewed in the morning of 24 th August. A self-evaluation audit has been undertaken on 30 case files. The Police have been informed their inspection will focus on sharing the vision for diversion, the understanding of officers and information sharing for assessments by the Procurator Fiscal Service or Justice Services. 4.	Housing First Project	CCh shared the Housing First project presentation. Please see presentation for full details.	
		If Housing have fire safety concerns for any individuals a referral is submitted to the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service to undertake a home fire safety visit.	
		Housing First will run parallel with the Scottish Housing on Release for Everyone (SHORE) standards. Housing First will provide more intensive support to individuals.	
		The Community Safety team are aware of the project, however they have not been directly linked to date.	
		Meetings have been arranged to link in with mental health and drug and alcohol services to inform them of the project.	
		Families could be considered for the project if they meet the criteria. It is anticipated that 10 properties will be allocated per year, for the next 3 years.	
		Partner agencies are invited to attend the 6 weekly review meetings. DB suggested that a Police representative is invited to the reviews, this will be explored in the near future.

6.	Identifying Priorities for Next Plan	The Scottish Government have published the new national strategy which identifies 13 national priorities. There is a requirement to identify local aims for Moray. The national priorities can be found in the attached document.

7.	Partner Updates	Secure Care Inspection LVZ met with Chris Wright, Inspector, who indicated this is a national inspection. The inspection has been split into 2 phases; phase 1 identifies what is in place nationally and local authories must submit the names of 2 young people who have been in secure care or considered for secure care. During phase 2 the Care Inspectorate will track 30 young people across Scotland; 12 young people who were considered for secure care, 12 young people who have been in secure care and 6 young people post-secure care for a 9 month period. A secure care standards workshop has been arranged to take place in the afternoon of 22 nd August. There will be no focus groups or file reading prior to the inspection.	
		Homelessness Homelessness is at a critical stage in terms of temporary accommocation and have resorted to using local B&Bs. This has been caused by staffing issues and high homelessness presentations. It is anticipated that this will continue into the coming months.	
		Scottish Prison Service An email update was received from MH.	
		Developments or updates since the last meeting The new HMP Highland is progressing well, with further ground works now complete with a view to moving to the next stage of the project build.	
		Upcoming events in the coming three months September will see a full calendar of recovery focused events culminating in the national recovery, with the prison staging its own internal version.	
		Any other relevant information Work towards the development of the recovery wing is progressing well, with staff being given the appropriate training.
