Introduction

JC welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked that everyone introduce themselves.

Jane Munro from Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) welcomed everyone to the Job Centre in Elgin and explained that her job is to look after employers and partners in Moray with the aim to get people into sustainable employment. DWP has budget to procure Training for unemployed, for example recently facilitated a 2 week construction course where the individual would receive 5 certificates at the end of the course. DWP works with local employers to provide work experience for example Springfield and Morrison construction in relation to the construction sector.

Employer Advisers provide information to clients, organise training and work closely with a group of disabled clients and employers to provide coaching and support.

Jane gave a recent example of partnership working between the NHS & DWP using a mobile health information bus which visited Lhanbryde and Huntly showing a universal credit video

	also providing assistance to access help on-line. Jane confirmed there is no app for universal credit but forms can be completed on phone, tablet and laptop. Library also has WIFI if no WIFI at home. There is also a digital skills course to be organised. There is office space available in the building occupied by DWP Elgin Job Centre Plus. 	3.	Moray Growth Deal - Progress	
		In the UK Government's budget announcement it was made clear there was funding for	
		further City Deals and Growth Deals although Moray wasn't specifically mentioned.	
		Clarification will be sought. There are a number of other authorities also working on deals	
		and at different stages of progress. There is a common expectation that to get Heads of	
		Terms localities would normally be mentioned in the statement. However, to date there has	
		been no clear line from government on this.	
		At key officers meeting in October RG had raised the significance of the Westminster budget	
		as a gateway as this impacted on the target date for Heads of Terms but was advised that	
		this wasn't a prerequisite by civil servants. The target date partners are working to will now	
		be pushed back to June 2018 and we have been assured that this is still ambitious but	
		realistic by those advisers. However, we will continue to seek clarity around this from civil	
		servants route and Cosla contacts.	
		The Growth Deal Programme Board has prioritised work on 8 out of the 14 strategic outline	
		cases and developed them to a good state of readiness. Work progresses to refine and	
		polish these for submission and work on the others will be done once the first 8 have been	
		completed. The target date to refine the first 8 cases is end of January 2018.	
		Engagement with Moray's larger employers has been done targeting 14 businesses in	
		Moray. There has been a good level of support for a Business Assembly as a sounding board	
		for the development of the deal with 4 or 5 to date willing and interested to participate.	
		This will not go launch until we have a good sense of support and degree of confidence. The	SH
		Assembly would need a core of consistent members who agree on media approach and	эп

	understand the deal process. The Growth Deal Board may be reconfigured in light of this. SH to speak to Donna Chisholm about it and put suggestions over to RG.
